DID YOU KNOW:

If you elect not to pay your assessment, the final cost could be from two to four times the original amount owed. After 60 days the account is turned over to our collection agency. This begins a process between you and the agency and will last until the account is resolved. After the account goes to the agency, several fees are added that the Association has no control over.



GUTTER CLEANING:



The annual gutter cleaning project has been pushed back and is scheduled to begin in early February, weather permitting. All of the exterior gutters will be cleaned out. It takes approximately two weeks to get through the entire complex, so please be patient. Please know that work may be delayed if the weather is too stormy for the crews to safely work on the ladders

LET'S HELP OUR MAIL CARRIER:

Please pick up your mail. The boxes are small and fill up quickly. If you are going to be gone for three days or more, fill out a "Mail Hold Card." If you get mail that belongs to your neighbor, you can place it in the "Out Box." Please do not write wrong address on the item. If you get mail with the wrong name but sent to your address, please strike a line through the address and place it in the "Out Box."

LANDSCAPING UPDATE:

Allied Landscaping has been here for only a few months, but they have really made a difference. Our community looks 100% better!

They are in the process of pruning our trees. They have done most of them but have more to go. If anyone has a special request, please call HAS. The tall trees are done at an additional cost to the Association. We need to consolidate the requests to get the best value.

The Board approved a landscaping improvement project along West Las Positas. Our objective was to hide the roots from the trees. Allied will remove the grass and plant some ground cover that will also add some color. We have picked a small area as a test to see how it will look.
